Pag-IBIG Fund Choral bags top prize in CSC Choral Competition

The Pag-IBIG Fund Choral took home the grand prize in the Civil Service Commission (CSC) Government Choral Competition held at the CCP Main Theater last September 30, 2014. The 21-member singing group wowed the judges with its rendition of “*Magkaisa*,” “*Mamayug Akun*,” and the contest song, “*Kaya Mong Maging Dakila*.” The group also won the Best Entry for NCR in the elimination round.

This is not the first time that the choral group has been recognized for its talent. In 2006 and in 2007, it placed third and second, respectively, in the PMAP Annual Search for Best Choral Group. In 2009, it placed first in the Philippine Social Security Association (PHILSSA) Christmas Carol Competition. And in 2011, it took the second place in the CSC Government Choral Competition.

“I am very proud of our choral. This is another example of what we can achieve through hard work, focus, discipline, and consistency. It has also guested in several TV shows and has spearheaded several outreach activities. Indeed, since its creation in 2005, the Pag-IBIG Fund Choral has proven to be an effective Ambassador of Goodwill for Pag-IBIG.
